## PUBLIC NOTICE AND REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE REQUEST BY HY-LINE CRUISES TO CHANGE ITS FERRY SERVICE BETWEEN HYANNIS AND NANTUCKET BY ADDING A SECOND HIGH-SPEED FERRY AND RETIRING ITS TRADITIONAL FERRY, THE M/V GREAT POINT

In accordance with Section 5 of the Enabling Act of the Woods Hole, Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket Steamship Authority ("SSA"),1 Hyannis Harbor Tours, Inc., d/b/a Hy-Line Cruises ("Hy-Line"), has asked the SSA for permission to build a new high-speed ferry for service between Hyannis and Nantucket that will replace its traditional mono-hull ferry on that route, the M/V Great Point. In its letter requesting this permission, Hy-Line has stated that:

The new vessel will be approximately 154 feet long (about twelve feet longer than its current high-speed vessel, the M/V Grey Lady), and will incorporate a third passenger deck with exterior seating. As preliminarily designed, the vessel will have 324 interior seats and 169 exterior seats, for a total of 493 seats. (Hy-Line's current high-speed vessel, the M/V Grey Lady, has a capacity of 300 passengers.)

As proposed by Hy-Line, the number of its daily high-speed ferry trips between Hyannis and Nantucket would change as follows:

Hy-Line would also operate additional high-speed ferry trips during the weekends of the Nantucket Daffodil Festival, the Nantucket Wine Festival Weekend, Memorial Day and Columbus Day (which it also does now with its other high-speed ferry, the M/V Lady Martha, which would no longer be used to provide any high-speed ferry service between Hyannis and Nantucket).

Also as proposed by Hy-Line, it would retire the M/V Great Point (which has a capacity of 720 passengers) and stop operating all of its traditional ferry trips between Hyannis and Nantucket. In 2013, the number of those daily traditional ferry trips were as follows:

Thus, if Hy-Line's request is approved, the SSA will be the only operator of traditional ferry service between Hyannis and Nantucket.

Because Hy-Line's proposed second high-speed ferry has yet to be constructed, its requested changes will not take place until next year (mid-May 2015) at the earliest.

The SSA requests comments from the public regarding Hy-Line's request.
